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**The International Class at
Yangming High School Regulation of Enrollment**

➤ **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

Parents of applicants who seek admission to the International Class at Yangming High school, applicants should meet **ONE (1)** of the following qualifications:

1. Children of foreign professionals (not including full-time teachers in short-term cram schools registered which are excluded in accordance with the Tutoring and Continuing Education Act), specified foreign professionals, and foreign senior professionals who meet the provisions of Article 4 of the "Foreign Professional Talent Acquisition and Employment Act"
 - (1) Foreign professionals: refers to foreigners who are allowed to engage in professional work in our country.
 - (2) Foreign specific professionals refer to foreign professionals in the preceding paragraph who have special expertise in science and technology, economics, education, culture, arts, sports, and other fields required by the country as announced by the central competent business authority.
 - (3) Foreign high-level professionals: refer to the high-level professionals required by our country as specified in Article 25, Paragraph 3, Subparagraph 2 of the Immigration Act.(<https://law.moj.gov.tw/ENG/LawClass/LawAll.aspx?pcode=D0080132>)
 - (4) Professional work: refers to the following work:
 - a.The jobs specified in Article 46, Paragraph 1, Paragraphs 1 to 3, 5, and 6 of the Employment Services Act.(<https://law.moj.gov.tw/ENG/LawClass/LawAll.aspx?pcode=N0090001>)
 - b. Work as specified in Article 48, Paragraph 1, paragraphs 1 and 3 of the Employment Services Act.
 - c.The Ministry of Education has approved the establishment of special classes for foreign professionals, specific foreign professionals, and children of foreign senior professionals who are teachers of subjects other than foreign languages.
 - d. Subjects stipulated in the Regulations for the Implementation of School-type Experimental Education, the Regulations on the Entrustment of Private Schools by Public Senior High Schools to Private Administering Experimental Education, and the Regulations for the Implementation of Non-School Type Experimental Education at the Higher and Lower Secondary Education Stages, Foreign Language Course Teaching, Teacher Training, Course Development, and Activities Promotion work.
2. Children who are eligible for the “Regulations for Children of Outstanding Overseas Scientific and Technological Talents to Study in Taiwan.”

3. Children of international talents such as returning scholars or managers, when they and their children have stayed abroad for more than one year continuously.
4. Students of bilingual education classes and language education classes in public national secondary schools set up in accordance with the “Implementation Plan for Improving my country’s Overseas Talent Acquisition Policy” by the National and Pre-school Education Administration of the Ministry of Education. Teachers at a public or registered private college/university or school established especially for foreign residents.

➤ **ADMISSION PROCEDURE**

1. Registration Date: 2024/05/13 to 2024/06/28

- (1) Online registration is adopted for this year's admissions. The registration website:

- (2) In addition, and in accordance with Article 3 of the Regulations on Experimental Education for Senior High Schools: "Schools should observe the following matters when handling experimental education":

(Schools must) Obtain the consent of the students themselves as well as their parents or guardians before the experimental education begins. "Therefore, please register candidates and parents and have them sign consent forms for students to participate in the experimental education (referred to as the overseas recruiting children's special class (Appendix 3))." After students have read the forms carefully, please upload the registration form. If admitted, the original copy must be submitted in duplicate when registering for admission.

- (3) Those who have completed the information and meet the application qualifications will be required to pass the first-stage qualification examination. After the announcement of the second-stage interview list, they will participate in parent interviews and student interviews. Ultimately, 30 candidates will be selected for admission to this program.

2. Registration Process and Required Documents:


- (1) Application Documents (All shall be required and uploaded to the online application platform.)

- A. Application form
- B. Passport photo; A copy of ID card for Taiwanese applicants or copies of ARC and passport for non-Taiwanese applicants.
- C. Agreement Form
- D. A copy of ARC, working visa and passport of the applicant's parent or guardian.
- E. A copy of a birth certificate, kinship notarization, or any official documents that show the relationship with the applicant.
- F. A copy of employment certificate of the parent or guardian (ONE (1) of the following):
 - i. Employment Gold Card.
 - ii. Certificate of employment AND Labor Insurance Card with the official seal of the company or the relevant agency.
 - iii. Children who are eligible for the " Regulations for Studying in Taiwan for Children of Outstanding Overseas Scientific and Technological Personnel" must attach documents approved by the Ministry of Education.
- G. Official school transcripts in English for the last TWO (2) years AND Certificate of Status Letter.

- (2) Please upload the above documents to the registration website.

- (3) Those who have been found to have forged information after inspection will be disqualified for registration and admission.

	b. Apply to “Outstanding overseas scientific and technological personnel”.

According to Ministry of Education (MOE)’s “complete stipulations in regulations for studying in Taiwan for children of outstanding overseas scientific and technological personnel” the MOE will expect those entering the bilingual class in public high school to be prepared to enter into and meet the expectations of local high school.

➤ **To parents, please ensure you and your children are aware and understand the following points.**

a. Be clear about the rationale of the international class program, curriculum specifications, curriculum framework (see Appendix 6), and graduation requirements. The curriculum materials of this program are mainly teacher generated English materials, supplemented by foreign textbooks depending on the teaching needs of teachers. Assessments and assignments are mainly in English, and they will fully comply with the school’s schedule.

b. If students require individual needs for Chinese language enhancement, individualized courses, and remedial after-school lessons, parents are responsible for the costs and must comply with the school’s schedule and regulations.

c. Participate in the Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) Meeting, course selection meeting, education system meeting, etc. These meetings are essential to helping your children to complete each semester.

d. Encourage and lead your children to follow and practice Academic integrity.

e. This class doesn’t offer a National Defense Education course. That means that students will be unable to substitute the draft requirements for High School education.

f. The instructional assessment system will be different from regular classes that means you cannot enter Taiwan’s university using the Star Plan through Taiwan's College Entrance System.

g. Evaluate your children’s language level prior to starting class. His or her Chinese and English abilities should be above the A2 level. Please also make sure he or she has the ability and motivation to self-learn.

h. Each semester, expect to pay a tuition fee. This class’s students will also need to pay a “personal course” fee to our school’s parents’ association account. This payment will pay for the courses that international class students need. The pay list will be uploaded at the end of each semester.

➤ **To students, please be aware of the following,**

a. Be clear about the course and program regulations, graduation requirements, and curriculum framework (see Appendix 6). The curriculum materials of this program are mainly teacher generated English materials, supplemented by foreign textbooks depending on the teaching needs of teachers. Assessments and assignments are mainly in English, and they will fully comply with the school’s schedule.

b. Please follow the rules of the school and each class. Please complete assignments on time.

c. Practice and embody the principles of academic integrity.

d. This class doesn’t offer a National Defense Education course. That means that students will be unable to substitute the draft requirements for High School education.

e. The instructional assessment system will be different from regular classes that means you cannot enter Taiwan's university using the Star Plan through Taiwan's College Entrance System.

f. Evaluate your children's language level prior to starting class. His or her Chinese abilities should be above the A1 level (<https://reurl.cc/zrV6W6>) and English abilities should be above the A2 level (<https://reurl.cc/eWrdOL>). Please also make sure he or she has the ability and motivation to self-learn.

Appendix 5

International Class at Yangming High School

Course Architecture

The “International Class” will be taught bilingually in both English and Chinese (except for Chinese and English language courses) and will follow CLIL (Content and Language Integrated Learning) curriculum guidelines. Each CLIL course will follow the four fundamentals of the CLIL curriculum as outlined in the European framework: content, communication, cognition, and culture. These four C’s are paramount to the acquisition of knowledge and for facilitating critical learning skills across languages.

This “International Class” program will start from the 112 academic year and last until the 114 academic year, which means that the bilingual courses will cover student learning from their first year (111) to their completion of High School in year 113.

The following outlines the course map for the International Class at Yangming High School

- a. Ministry-mandated required courses: English, Math, and Physical Education are required courses. The subject English is instructed only in English. Math is instructed by bilingual teachers, and Physical Education is taught in Chinese. Foreign teachers will collaborate with the instructors according to the learning situations of students.
- b. Intercultural Communication courses : These courses are for students to recognize the history of the campus as well as the culture and ethos of the school. These classes include School Activities, Class Meetings, and an Elective Club.
- c. Academic-development courses (required) : Research Methods and Miscellaneous Academic Topic Exploration” are required courses at our school. These courses take two full years to complete. Students in the international class will be required to complete one full research paper as well as a presentation entirely in English.
- d. Elective subjects: For electives, students will be allowed to choose from the following courses: Mandarin Chinese, Social Sciences (which includes History, Geography, and Civics and Society), Science (which includes Physics, Chemistry, Biology, and Earth Science), Inquiry and Application of Natural Sciences, Arts and Life Sciences (which includes Music, Arts and Life, and Home Economics)” and Information Technology (which includes Computer Science and Living Technology). We cooperate with the Department of Chinese as a Second Language in universities and recruit their teachers to lecture Mandarin Chinese with the collaboration of foreign English teachers. Arts and Life and Information Technology are domain-specific courses on the curriculum guidelines taught in Chinese. Civics and Society is inquiry-based, and mainly focuses on SDGs issues; some units on international affairs are taught in Mandarin Chinese and English. The rest of the subjects are taught in Mandarin Chinese and English. Instructors of elective courses are able to collaborate with foreign teachers according to the learning situations of students.
- e. Individualized Curriculum : Students can arrange their own course map based on their pick of the modular courses offered. This way, students can tailor their courses to their individual learning needs.
 - (a) The courses that are elective and can be picked from include: Academic Research, Multiple Skills, Entrepreneurship, Test prep, SAT prep, preparation for studying abroad, and many more.
 - (b) Students can select courses after they appear in the online course selection system, however, we cannot guarantee a spot in the class since class sizes and offerings are limited. Unfortunately, that means course selection is on a “first come, first serve” basis and once the class fills up, we can’t allow any additional students past the limit. At the end of each semester, we will distribute and collect surveys from the student body and use these surveys to determine which elective courses will be offered in the following year.

(c) “Let students be their own master in learning” is our creed here at Yangming High School. In order for us to fulfill our mission, we encourage our students to embark on a journey of self-discovery in terms of academia. Students will be encouraged to think critically, use information learned in class to create new ideas, and synthesize and interpret information from across academic disciplines. We encourage our students to constantly ask questions. We also have a system to help our students choose classes at other schools for their individualized curriculum courses. This has been established according to a Taiwanese law called “Taipei City Senior High School’s Students to other school take course and transference” wherein students may elect to choose courses to attend at other high schools around Taipei City. This option is not limited to Individualized Courses but can include any courses students want to attend.

(d) All these courses (under the individualized course label) are optional and therefore include an extra charge for instruction that will cover, the hourly rate for the instructor, material fees, and expenses for renting equipment.

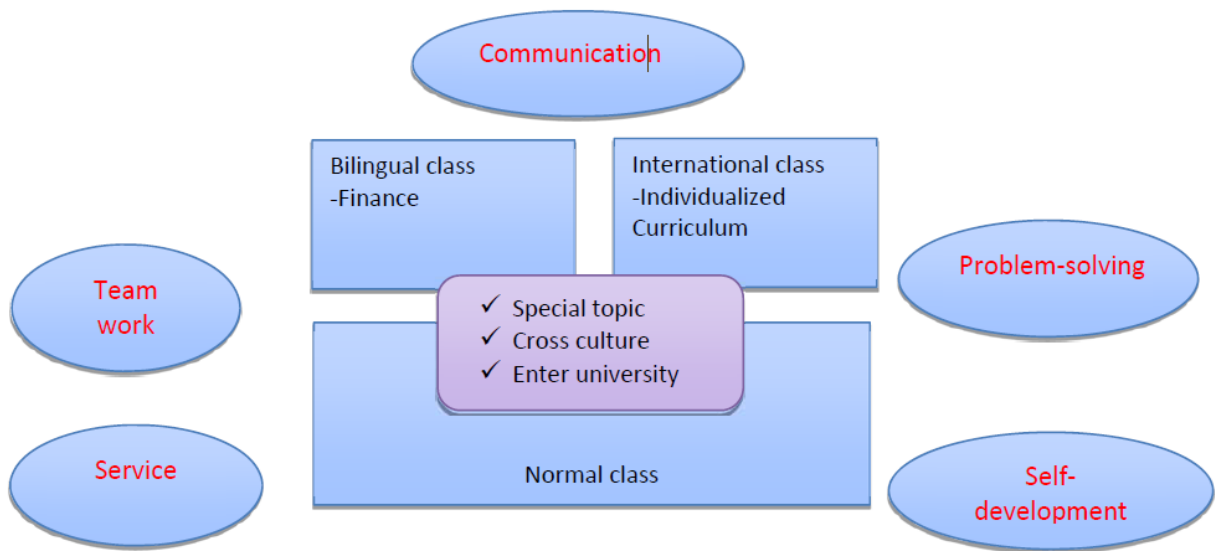


Photo : "International Class" courses connection

International Class at Yangming High School Courses' structure and academic credit

As a student in the International Class, the following are required subjects. Each semester in first and second grade there will be 17 academic credits. In the third grade, each semester will have 7 academic credits. In total you will get 82 academic credits over the course of three years.

Our school has a goal that we call the FIVE STARTS. These are self-development, teamwork, attention to society, international relations, and problem-solving. These required subjects are the basic academic foundation while elective subjects are intended as supplementary knowledge.

In our school we also offer clubs, alternative curriculum periods, and allow our students to choose the topics that they are interested in for their research. We have lots of events and activities to foster a strong community culture among the student body.
